When fall protection is being used, workers are safe and complying with OSHA standards.



A= Anchor point B=Full Body Harness C=Lifeline



Guardrails or safety nets can be used instead of full-body harnesses, but you will rarely see this on a residential roofing job.

When no fall protection is being used, this is dangerous and violates OSHA standards.



Don't take any chances. If you're on a roof, talk to your roofing contractor. You could save a life!
