FINANCE COMMITTEE MEETING NOTES OF MAY 15, 2023

IN ATTENDANCE: VICE CHAIR MATT CHABOT, MICHELE HAMILTON.

IN THE AUDIENCE NEWLY ELECTED SELECTMAN JOE FREITAS.

After discussion, a motion was made by Michele Hamilton to accept the minutes of May 2, 2023, Matt Chabot seconded the motion. A call to vote was requested by Matt Chabot. The motion was approved unanimously as written.

Reserve fund transfer request/discussion with Chief Fournier

Received a request for a transfer from the Reserve fund of \$5,000.00 from the fire department Chief Scott Fournier. The purpose of this request is to repair the pump on E-3. This expenditure is extraordinary and/or unforeseen. The pump is broken, and the repair account is traditionally unfunded.

According to Chief Fournier the ability to draw water from the water source to fill tank has been unproductive since February 16, 2023, and the current balance in the maintenance line is \$700.00. They need the additional \$5,000 to repair the pump.

After discussion, a motion was made by Michele Hamilton to approve the transaction to transfer the \$5,000.00 to the Fire Department for the repair of E-3 Tank. The motion was seconded by Matt Chabot. A call to vote was requested by Matt Chabot and the motion was approved unanimously.

A brief topic of conversation took place regarding the public safety building and the \$200,000.00 to be utilized on reinvasions for both the police and fire departments. Each side is requesting \$100,000.00. The fire side is considering adding residential quarters and the police are considering extra rooms. none of these funds are coming from taxes. By adding or repairing the structures we can add 10 more years to the building.

Review and discuss the budget changes for fiscal year 2024

The purpose of this meeting is to go over the budget one more time to make sure that the items that have been changed agree with all members of the committee. We walked through the line items colored in blue; these are the numbers that were changed and need to be verified by all members.

A brief discussion took place regarding changes within the front-page regarding revenue changes; New growth at

State Aid Local at \$727,374; Public Library \$14,499; EMS Receipts Reserved Account at \$575,000 and Operating Free Cash at \$254,834. We are following the estimates of Senate Ways and Means (SWM) cherry sheet funds and we know that these funds can fluctuate between increase and decrease daily. Thus, the reason for us to review continuously this information so we can be sure that we are providing a sustainable budget for the future of the taxpayer of Berkeley.

The information below are the account numbers, name of account, the increase/decrease dollar change per line within the specific code/department, the Finance Committee FY2024 final adjustment for that specific line and reason.
