- Call to Order Arlene Mederios called the meeting to order at 9:30 in the hearing room. She reminded everyone that the meeting is being recorded. Margaret Moroff arrived as the meeting was being called to order.

- III. FY 2024 Budget Krista Celia presented the financial report for November 30, 2024

 - 3. Program Donations: \$10,931.93
 - 4. General Donations: \$4,723.39
