

#### Sewing Through Hard Times

Did you know...?

During the turbulent times in the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, especially during the Great Depression that followed the stock market crash of 1929, not all women could afford the newest fashions in clothing. The majority had to make do with what was available to create wearable clothes. Often this led to recycling what they had. As early as the late 1800s, flour and animal feed began to be sold in rough fabric sacks rather than wooden barrels. These bags were often recycled into rags and towels. By the 1910s, some goods like flour and sugar were packaged in lighter, softer cotton sacks. Resourceful women creatively recycled these cotton sacks into things like undergarments, bed sheets, curtains, and clothing for the family, including dresses. As a result, feed companies started to cater to the farmers' wives by creating more designs in a variety of colors and thereby selling more feed!



Although the Berkley Historical Society does not have a feed sack dress or article of clothing, we would be very interested in seeing one. If you have something made from the feed sack, please bring it to the BHS Museum.

We would love to see it!
