Ms. Martin-Sterling stated that it was a 23% increase, as last year's assessment was \$805,960. Old Business	Board to discuss and vote on Text My Gov. Ms. Martin-Sterling stated that she thought it would be beneficial for the town, especially in this day and age. She stated that it is \$3000 for the initial year and would be using CARES Act moneys. After the initial year, the cost is \$2500 with a two-year contract. Ms. Martin-Sterling stated that they can send out mass alert texts. She also mentioned that people can send in key words to get responses. Mr. Larabee stated that his biggest concern was the number of texts. Ms. Martin-Sterling stated that there are 50,000 texts allowed per year. Discussion continued. The Board of Selectmen voted to accept the grant. Ms. Martin-Sterling stated that starting April 1 st , the COA will slowly start opening back up, but she did ask for no exercise classes be offered. The public hearing will be conducted via Zoom, at https://us02web.zoom.us/j/82691298546, Meeting ID 826 912 8546, Passcode and in accordance with the Governor's Order Suspending Certain Provisions of the Open Meeting Law, D.L. c. 30A, § 20 as well as in the Moitoza-Petty Hearing Room at the Town Hall, One North Main St, Berkley, Massachusetts 02779. Ms. Martin-Sterling stated that everything has cleared with town council and noted that this is a brand-new license, not a transfer. The applicant stated that this was his first package store. He stated that they will be open 10am-10pm and Sunday 10am-6pm and will have 5 employees to start. The applicant also mentioned that they will also be selling snack items, lottery, and tobacco. They hope to open by Memorial Day Weekend.
