MEDICARE CHANGES

Effective May 1, 2024 Medicare Savings Programs will no longer consider assets when determining eligibility, only income will be considered.

MSPs are programs that pay for some or all of Medicare beneficiaries' premiums, deductibles, copays, and coinsurance.

MSPs are not insurance plans. They are programs designed to help lower the costs of your Medicare insurance coverage. They are always combined with Medicare.

QUALIFYING for a Medicare Savings Program (MSP)

How do I get an MSP?

You may be able to get an MSP only, or to get both an MSP and Masshealth. To get an MSP, you must have countable income under the income limits in the table.

Do these changes affect you? If you think you may qualify, contact the Berkley Council on Aging. A SHINE counselor from another community will be available by appointment to assist with these changes.

A/C Drive for **Berkley Seniors**

The Town of Berkley launched a summer pilot program to provide window air conditioners to seniors who need help staying cool.

Eligibility & Process - Open to Berkley senior residents only, first come, first served, police and fire/EMS will install, recipient names/address will remain confidential.

MOMENTS FROM THE MUSEUM

Covered Bridges of Massachusetts

Did you know...?

Massachusetts at one time had over 100 covered bridges dating back to the early 1700s. Today, only a handful remain. Once a common sight, many bridges have been lost to time, weather, and replaced with more modern structures or destroyed by weather. Some of the surviving covered bridges are historic, while others are 20th-century replicas designed to preserve the architectural heritage. Covered bridges were initially built to protect the wooden structure from the elements (rain and snow) which would cause them to rot and decay. Covering the bridges also helped to preserve the intricate framework and wooden trusses, significantly extending their lifespan. In addition to their practical function, covered bridges also served as community gathering places and even inspired local storytelling. Uncovered wooden bridges had a shorter lifespan of approximately 20 years.
