The Town of Berkley is seeking a community-minded volunteer to serve on the Conservation Commission.

The Conservation Commission plays an important role in protecting the town's natural resources, including wetlands, waterways, wildlife habitat, forests, and open space. Commission members review applications under the Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act, conduct site visits, and help guide local conservation efforts.

### **Responsibilities**

- Attend regular Commission meetings and occasional site visits
- Review permit applications and environmental projects
- Help protect and preserve the community's natural resources
- Work collaboratively with residents, town boards
- Support conservation, open space, and environmental stewardship initiatives

### **Qualifications**

No prior experience is required. Individuals with an interest in environmental conservation, land use planning, natural resources, engineering, biology, agriculture, or related fields are encouraged to apply. Training opportunities are available. A commitment to learning and serving the community is most important.

### **Time Commitment**

Commission members are volunteers appointed by the Select Board. Members typically attend monthly or twice-monthly meetings, along with site visits and training sessions.
